With readings of hitherto unexplored chapters in Delanos Voyages and Travels in the Northern and Southern Hemispheres and other nonfiction sources--such as Joseph Dupuiss Journal of a Residence in Ashantee --Stuckey links Benito Cereno and Moby-Dick, pinpointing the sources from which Melville drew to fashion major characters that appear aboard both the Pequod and the San Dominick. Combining inventive literary and historical analysis, Stuckey shows how myriad aspects of African culture coalesced to create the unique vision conveyed in Moby-Dick and Benito Cereno. Ultimately, African Culture and Melvilles Art provides a wealth of insight into the novelists expressive power and the development of his distinct cross-cultural aesthetic.
